SECTION 4: First aid measures

4.1. Description of first aid measures

General information	Chemical burns must be treated by a physician.
Inhalation	Remove person to fresh air and keep comfortable for breathing. For breathing difficulties, oxygen may be necessary. Keep affected person under observation. Place unconscious person on their side in the recovery position and ensure breathing can take place. Get medical attention immediately.
Ingestion	Rinse mouth thoroughly with water. Do not induce vomiting. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. If breathing stops, provide artificial respiration. Place unconscious person on their side in the recovery position and ensure breathing can take place. Get medical attention immediately.
Skin contact	Remove contaminated clothing and rinse skin thoroughly with water. Continue to rinse for at least 10 minutes. Get medical attention if symptoms are severe or persist after washing. Wash clothing and clean shoes thoroughly before reuse.
Eye contact	Remove any contact lenses and open eyelids wide apart. Rinse with water. Continue to rinse for at least 15 minutes and get medical attention. If in doubt, get medical attention promptly.

4.2. Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed

Inhalation	May cause damage to mucous membranes in nose, throat, lungs and bronchial system. Shortness of breath. Burning sensation in the throat May cause coughing and difficulties in breathing.
Ingestion	This product is corrosive. May cause chemical burns in mouth, oesophagus and stomach. Blood may be vomited There may be bleeding from the mouth and/or nose. May cause severe internal injury.
Skin contact	This product is corrosive. Blistering may occur. May cause serious chemical burns to the skin. Progressive ulceration will occur if treatment is not immediate
Eye contact	Causes serious eye damage. Corneal damage. May cause permanent damage.
