4.1. Description of first aid measures

General information	Chemical burns must be treated by a physician.
Inhalation	Remove person to fresh air and keep comfortable for breathing. For breathing difficulties, oxygen may be necessary. Keep affected person under observation. Place unconscious person on their side in the recovery position and ensure breathing can take place. Get medical attention immediately.

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Inhalation	May cause damage to mucous membranes in nose, throat, lungs and bronchial system. Shortness of breath. Burning sensation in the throat May cause coughing and difficulties in breathing.
Ingestion	This product is corrosive. May cause chemical burns in mouth, oesophagus and stomach. Blood may be vomited There may be bleeding from the mouth and/or nose. May cause severe internal injury.
